Cowboy Quick Hits

The Cowboys are 1-0 on the season after a trip to California where OSU defeated No. 24 Stanford, 29-7. The win against the Cardinal marked John Smith's 450th career dual win as head coach of his alma mater. He needs 43 more to pass Harold Nichols and take over second place on the list of all-time Division 1 wrestling coaching wins.

OSU is coming off of a 10-0 2020-21 season, which marked the 47th undefeated dual season in program history. In March, the Pokes won a share of their ninth-consecutive Big 12 tournament title and finsihed third at the NCAA Championships. The Cowboy lineup features five returning All-Americans and two Big 12 champions from last season.

MEDIA INFORMATION AND POLICIES

The Oklahoma State athletic communications office welcomes you to another season of Cowboy wrestling. The communications staff is here to assist members of the media in their coverage of Oklahoma State athletics. Please take a moment to become familiar with the following media policies.

CREDENTIALS

Members of the media should contact Reid Romine in the Oklahoma State media relations office to request credentials to OSU wrestling duals (reid.romine@okstate.edu or 210-860-5959). Credentials can be picked up at the southeast pass gate of Gallagher-Iba Arena on match days. Credential pickup will be available one hour prior to the start of each dual and will close five minutes before the duals begins.

INTERVIEWS

Media interview requests for Oklahoma State head coach John Smith, assistant coaches and wrestlers should be directed to Reid Romine in the OSU media relations office. Coaches and wrestlers are typically available for interviews before practice starts on Wednesday (usually around 2:00 p.m. CT), but other arrangements can be made.

MEDIA PARKING

Members of the media attending duals at Gallagher-Iba Arena should park in the lot just south of Boone Pickens Stadium. The entrance to the lot is off Knoblock Street. No parking pass is necessary for entry into the lot.

VISITING RADIO, PHONE LINES

Phone lines will be provided to the primary radio broadcast crews for both the Cowboys and the visiting team. Additional lines are available to the media on a first-come, first-serve basis.

PHOTOS AND VIDEO

Photographers may shoot from the east and west sides of the mat, but are prohibited from shooting in front of either team's bench. Photographers and videographers must stay seated while shooting to avoid obstructing fans' views.

COWBOYS ON THE AIR

Rex Holt is in his 38th year broadcasting Oklahoma State Cowboy Wrestling. OSU wrestling can be heard on its primary home of 93.7 KSPI-FM radio in Stillwater. Occasional events are aired on 105.5 KGFY-FM radio or 780 AM radio Stillwater should programming conflicts arise. Any time the Cowboys are on the air, the live broadcast can also be accessed live on the official website of OSU athletics, www. okstate.com.

Head Coach | 31st Year | Oklahoma State, 1988

Smith begins his 31st season at Oklahoma State in the 2021-22 season, after accepting the head coaching position at his alma mater in 1992. The accolades and accomplishments since that time are remarkable. In his 30 complete seasons at the helm five NCAA team titles in 1994, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006, and he has coached 33 NCAA individual champions and five Olympians. Under his watch, the Cowbovs have brought 21 team conference tournament championships, two Big 12 regular season titles and 126 individual conference titles back to Stillwater. He has seen his student-athletes earn All-America recognition 148 times, an average of 4.9 All-America honorees per year

The sixth-ranked Oklahoma State wrestling team (1-0 overall; 0-0 Big 12) will hit the road this week for a top-15 matchup with Minnesota. The Cowboys and No. 11 Golden Gophers will square off at 7 p.m. CT on Saturday in Maturi Pavilion.

On the Air

The dual with Minnesota will be televised on Big Ten Network with Shane Sparks and Jim Gibbons on the call. It can also be heard on the radio Saturday evening with Rex Holt on the call beginning at 6:30 p.m. CT on Pete 94.3 KSPI FM or KSPI-AM 780. Live stats can be found on Trackwrestling.com.

The Series - Minnesota

Oklahoma State and Minnesota have met a total of 41 times since the first meeting in 1941, which was a 18-6 win for the Cowboys. OSU improved its record in the series to 27-14 after winning the last meeting between the schools in 2019. OSU has won the last five duals with the Golden Gophers after Minnesota had won four of five matches from 2012 to 2014.

About the Cowboys

Oklahoma State is 1-0 in its 2021-22 season as the Cowboys defeated No. 24 Stanford in their season opener last Saturday.

The Pokes return five All-Americans from a squad that won the program's ninth-consecutive Big 12 tournament title and placed third at the NCAA Championships in March. Led by individual national champion AJ Ferrari and two-time national finalist and Senior world silver medalist Daton Fix, the Cowboy lineup is loaded with a combination of proven veterans and young potential.

Three true freshman started nearly every dual for the Cowboys in the 2020-21 season. Trevor Mastrogiovanni (125), Dustin Plott (174) and Ferrari (197) combined to go 50-13 overall and 27-2 in duals. Each qualified for the NCAA Championships with Mastrogiovanni making it to the Round of 16, while Ferrari became the third true freshman in program history to win an individual national championship.

Redshirt seniors Dakota Geer and Dusty Hone elected to return for one final season in Stillwater after the NCAA granted winter-sport athletes an extra year of eligibility. Geer moved back to 184 pounds in 2021 where he secured All-America honors for the third time, placing fifth at nationals. Hone looks to claim the starting postion at 141 pounds, but will have to hold off freshman Carter Young who placed third at the Senior World Team Trials in September.

In the middle of the Cowboy lineup, Travis Wittlake and Wyatt Sheets continue to be a dangerous pair as the duo has combined to go 112-39 in their careers. Both Cowboys are coming off an NCAA tournament where they earned All-America status for the second year in a row.

Austin Harris made major strides in his second year at heavyweight, going 12-8 overall and had a strong finish to his season making it to the Round of 12 after being the No. 29 seed at his first NCAA Championships. However, sophomore Luke Surber got the nod for the starting spot against Stanford and won by way of a 14-3 major decision.

Cowboys in the Polls

Oklahoma State's roster features 10 wrestlers ranked in various polls this week, with four holding spots inside the top-10. Sophomore 197-pounder AJ Ferrari is the consensus No. 1 wrestler at his weight and is the highest ranked Cowboy, after winning his first individual title at the NCAA Championships in March. Following Ferrari, Daton Fix appears at No. 2 at 133 pounds as the reigning Big 12 champion and national finalist.

Also making appearances in the top 10 of their respective weight classes are All-Americans Travis Wittlake and Dakota Geer. Wittlake is as high as No. 6 at 165 pounds in the *Intermat* rankings, while Geer is ranked sixth at 184 pounds by *FloWrestling*.

Wyatt Sheets (157) is 1-0 on the season and ranked No. 14 by *Intermat* after wrestling his way to a spot on the podium from the No. 33 seed at the NCAA tournament. At 141 pounds, Dusty Hone moved up in the polls as he jumped to No. 14 after his major decision at Stanford. Kaden Gfeller (149) is the No. 22 ranked wrestler at 149 pounds.

Sophomores Trevor Mastrogiovanni and Dustin Plott maintain their spots in the polls as they return to the lineup for their second season. Mastrogiovanni (125) is ranked as high as No. 16 by *FloWrestling*, while Plott holds down the No. 15 spot in *Intermat's* poll at 174 pounds. Luke Surber was ranked by *Intermat* for the first time in his career as he sits at No. 28 in the heavyweight polls after collecting his first career dual win against Stanford.

In 2018, coach John Smith assumed the title of winningest active head coach in NCAA Division I wrestling when the Pokes defeated Minnesota on Nov. 19, inside Gallagher-Iba Arena.

Since that time, Smith has added 40 more dual

victories to the record books. Smith reached yet another milestone in last season's 36-4 dual win against Little Rock. The victory was Smith's 443rd and moved him past Gary Taylor and into the top three on the list of all-time Divison 1 coaching wins.

OSU's victory over Stanford to open the 2021-22 season marked Smith's 450 dual win as head coach of his alma mater. He needs 43 more victories to pass Harold Nichols and move into second place.

World Class

Daton Fix added to an already impressive freestyle resume this fall when he brought home a silver medal from the Senior World Championships.

He dominated his competition at the U.S. World Team Trials, going 4-0 with two tech falls and outscoring his opponents by a combined score of 41-5. He clinched his spot on the Senior World Team for the second time in his career after doing so in 2019.

Fix continued his run through the 61 kg bracket at the World Championships making it to the gold medal match. In his first four matches, the junior outscored his opponents 41-0, winning each match via technical fall. Ultimately, he fell in the final match by a score of 4-1 to Russia's Abasgadzhi Magomedov.

His silver medal marks the highest finish by an OSU wrestler since 1993 and gives the program 19 total medals at the World Championships.

Match to Watch

A matchup of All-Americans is on the slate at 157 pounds between Wyatt Sheets and Brayton Lee.

Sheets finished last season on the podium after originally being left out of the tournament but was a late addition as the No. 33 seed when another wrestler withdrew from the tournament. Lee was the sixth seed in the bracket and ultimately claimed a sixth-place finish.

Early in the 2021-22 season, Lee is 4-0 and ranked No. 5 at 157 pounds, while Sheets is ranked No. 14 and won his first match of the season by way of a 6-3 decision against Charles Darracott (STAN).

Year Two Ahead

Last season, three true freshman who were a part of the nation's top-rated signing class started nearly every dual for the Cowboys.

The trio of Trevor Mastrogiovanni (125), Dustin Plott (174) and AJ Ferrari (197) combined to go 50-13 overall and 27-2 in duals. Back in the lineup in their second year in Stillwater, the trio is expected to play a large role in reaching the goals set for the Cowboys this season.

At 125 pounds, Mastrogiovanni filled the void left behind by three-time All-American and four-time Big 12 champion Nick Piccininni last season. He went 15-6 on the season and 9-1 in dual matches, with his only loss coming to No. 11 Brody Teske (UNI). He hit his stride in the postseason, making it to the Round of 16 at the NCAA Championships.

Plott also went 15-6 in his freshman campaign at

174 pounds. The Tuttle, Okla. native finished third at the Big 12 tournament before going 1-2 in his first appearance at nationals, while dealing with a shoulder injury.

At 197 pounds, Ferrari adjusted quickly to the college ranks going 20-1 en route to winning individual conference and national titles. The fourth seed at the NCAA Championships, Ferrari worked his way through a loaded bracket, which included an upset of No. 1 Myles Amine (MICH) in the semifinals. He became the third true freshman in program history to win an individual national championship.

John Smith's Coaching Tree

John Smith's coaching tree is undoubtedly the largest in the collegiate wrestling world.

Seven of Smith's former wrestlers at Oklahoma State are now head coaches running their own programs across the nation, not to mention the numerous assistant coaches, along with Glen Lanham, who was a teammate of Smith at OSU, and Mark Cody, a graduate assistant at OSU, who are now both head coaches.

Smith has had the advantage over his former wrestlers carrying a 21-1 dual record against them when they match up head-to-head as coaches. His only loss came from Pat Popolizio when NC State defeated the Cowboys 19-15 in 2015.

Coached by the Best

When wrestlers come to compete at Oklahoma State, they are coached by some of the greatest to ever step on the mat. John Smith holds six world championships and two Olympic gold medals. Smith, Zack Esposito, Chris Perry and Tyler Caldwell also combine for five NCAA championships and 13 All-America honors. Smith brings in a plethora of international coaching experience. Most recently, he coached the 2017 USA Women's Cadet World Team, for which he was named USA Wrestling Women's Co-Coach of the Year alongside Campbell's Kary Kolat

Esposito has had a hand in coaching World teams for the past four years, including two Cadet World Teams, a first-place Junior World Team and title-winning World Cup Team.

All They Do is Win

Since breaking into the starting lineup for Oklahoma State, Daton Fix (133) and Travis Wittlake (165) have put themselves into the record books for their winning percentage.

At 48-3 in his career, Daton Fix has a winning percentage of 94.11%, which is good for No. 14 on the list of highest winning percentages ever among OSU wrestlers. Interestingly enough, No. 13 on the list and one spot ahead of Fix at 94.4% is Cowboy head coach John Smith.

As for Wittlake, he is 50-6 since taking over the starting spot at 165 pounds in the 2019-20 season. He sits at No. 41 on the list with a winning percentage of 89.28%.



Dual Notes

Wrestling's House of Horrors
No venue in America has a richer wrestling tradition than Gallagher-Iba Arena, home of Oklahoma State wrestling since 1939. In its beginning as Gallagher Hall, the gymnasium was named for Edward Clark Gallagher, the Oklahoma A&M wrestling mentor who never wrestled competitively but became the greatest coach of his time.

Since wrestling began in Gallagher-Iba Arena, the Cowboys have won 25 NCAA titles and have had 44 unbeaten and untied campaigns at home, the most recent coming in 2021. One of the program's longest winning streaks ran with the arena's opening in 1939 and lasted until Feb. 16, 1951. During that period, Oklahoma State won 37 straight home duals, with no ties.

Gallagher-Iba Arena has proved to be one of the most difficult venues for opponents to win in across all of college sports, as the Cowboy wrestling program boasts an impressive 496-42-6

overall record in the arena.

From the final dual of 1959 through the first five home duals of the 1967 season, Oklahoma State wrestled 67 duals without a loss, finishing with an impressive 60-0-1 record before Oklahoma broke the streak, 19-13.

OSU's most recent home winning streak of 50 consecutive duals was the second-longest such streak without a loss or tie, as it began near the end of the 1986 season and lasted until Jan. 30,

The Cowboys currently hold a 23-match winning streak at home, dating back to Jan. 27, 2018. At 23, the run is the fourth-longest streak in program history. If that streak stays alive, then the dual with Northern Iowa on Jan. 30 would mark win No. 500 in Gallagher-Iba Arena.



STILLWATER -The seventh-ranked Cowboy wrestling team (2-1; 0-0) notched its second dual win of the season Sunday, defeating Minnesota, 21-12, inside Gallagher-Iba Arena. The win marked coach John Smith's 428th dual victory, making him the fifth all-time winningest coach in NCAA DI wrestling.

The victory over the Gophers (1-2; 0-0) marks Oklahoma State's first win against a ranked opponent this season. The Pokes took six of 10 bouts from Minnesota, including a 3-2 win from no. 4 Nick Piccininni to open the dual and a fall from freshman 133-pounder Reece Witcraft in his first dual at Gallagher-Iba.

"It was good to see Reece pick up the escape, get a takedown and change the momentum," Smith said. "You have to create the opportunity to pin someone. You're not going to just go throw them on their backs. You have to score some points let them know you're coming, and he did a good job of getting back in the match, being competitive and found himself in a familiar position where he took him to his back and held him there'

The 133-pound Cowboy fell behind early in the first period but scored an escape and takedown to close the gap before time expired. He escaped to start the second and turned a low single into a cradle to collect the fall over Brent Jones in 3:56.

"I've been training my whole life for this," Witcraft said. "I was ready for it. It was a dream come true. I've never felt so happy in my life. I got that pin, and I couldn't even be intense I was so happy

Cowboy Dusty Hone wrestled in the third bout of the afternoon and held his own against No.4 Mitch McKee at 141 pounds but fell short in a hard-fought, 10-5, decision.

The 149-pound matchup featured two undefeated wrestlers in No. 6 Boo Lewallen and No. 10 Brayton Lee. Tied heading into the third period, Lewallen turned Lee for four nearfall points and gained the lead with less than 1:15 remaining. Lewallen secured riding time and won the decision, 8-3.

"I was a little bit concerned when he got taken down at the end of the second, but he took it to another level on top and picked up a turn, and that was the difference," Smith said. "Those are exciting matches to watch. You're always talking about separating the score against your opponent, but when that doesn't happen you have to dig deep and find ways to win, which he did a good job of."

In the 157-pound bout, Wyatt Sheets defeated Carson Brolsma, 8-1, with a third-period double leg takedown and four-point turn. No.15 Travis Wittlake collected his first dual vin inside GIA with a 5-3 decision over Minnesota's Bailee O'Reilly in the following bout.

OSU then dropped back-to-back matches at 174 and 184 pounds when Andrew Shomers fell to 10th-ranked Devin Skatzka and No. 18 Anthony Montalvo lost to Owen Webster Redshirt junior Dakota Geer locked up the dual result shortly after, defeating Garrett Jones via a 7-2 decision at 197 pounds The Cowboy racked up two takedowns and tacked on a point for riding time.

The final match featured heavyweight Austin Harris, who dropped his bout to Robert Steveson.







STANFORD, Calif. - The fourth-ranked Oklahoma State wrestling team defeated No. 24 Stanford, 29-7, in its first match of the season on Saturday.

The win marks John Smith's 450th dual win as head coach of the Cowboys. He is in third place on the list of all-time Division 1 wrestling coaching wins, needing 43 more to pass Harold Nichols and move into second place.

The Cowboys started off strong, building a 10-0 lead through the first three matches. No. 19 Trevor Mastrogiovanni began his sophomore campaign with a 5-2 decision over Logan Ashton, while No. 2 Daton Fix won a 7-3 decision against Jackson DiSario. Dusty Hone secured Oklahoma State's first bonus-point win of the season with a 9-0 major decision at 141 pounds.

No. 14 Wyatt Sheets picked up his first win of the season in a 6-3 decision over Charles Darracott to get the Cowboys back in the win column after No. 7 Jaden Abas picked up a major decision over Kaden Gfeller at 149 pounds. The only other match Stanford won was a 4-0 decision at 165 pounds for the reigning national champion at 165 pounds, Shane Griffith over No. 6 Travis Wittlake.

OSU closed out the dual with four consecutive wins at the upper weights to widen the gap and seal the victory over the Cardinal. Dustin Plott held off a late surge by Tyler Eischens for a 7-6 decision before two-consecutive bonus-point wins came at the hands of Dakota Geer and AJ Ferrari.

Geer picked up where he left off last season when he led the team in bonus-point wins. He attacked early and often in his bout with Ethan Woods and collected a 22-7 technical fall in 6:21. As for Ferrari, he began his title defense with a 16-3 major decision over No. 25 Nick Stemmet.

The final match of the day marked the first dual win for Luke Surber. A sophomore from Tuttle, Oklahoma, Surber bumped up a weight class in the offseason to compete for the job at heavyweight. He was dominant as he closed out the dual with a 14-3 major decision and the third bonus-point victory in a row for the Cowboys.

"It was pretty good," Surber said. "I can build off of it with a lot more fakes and shots and stuff to push the pace more, especially at heavyweight. I think I can use that to my advantage with my speed and athleticism. Overall, I think it was a good performance."
